History:

Established as a nonprofit organization in 1969, the American Nephrology Nurses Association (ANNA) has a membership of approximately 7,000 nephrology nurses. ANNA operates under a constitution and bylaws and serves its members through a national structure and local chapters. Members include registered nurses and other health care professionals with varying experience and expertise in hemodialysis, home therapies, chronic kidney disease, continuous renal replacement therapies, acute care, and transplantation.

Organizational Structure:

The **National Board of Directors** is elected annually by the membership and consists of the President, President-Elect, Immediate Past President, Treasurer, Secretary, and three Directors.

Chapters:

Members may join one of ANNA's 66 local chapters. Chapters provide ANNA with a local and grassroots perspective of important issues in their area. Chapters also circulate important news and views between their members and the national office. ANNA provides volunteers with leadership development at its annual Volunteer Leaders Workshop.

Specialty Practice Networks (SPNs):

Specialty Practice Networks consist of members with expertise in various subspecialties of nephrology nursing and serve as a network for members to share information, advice, and support within the subspecialty. ANNA members can participate in any of nine SPNs - Acute Care, Administration, Advanced Practice, Chronic Kidney Disease, Educator, Hemodialysis, Home Therapies, Pediatric Nephrology, and Transplantation.
